Now that we are into the summer term many of us will be thinking about the changes that are on the horizon for our children. Read on for more details on how you can access training around the subject of 'Transition'.



## Transition

We are fast approaching that time of year where the children and young people will be transitioning into new classes and/or new schools or settings. Now is the time to consider what you can do to support and ease them through what can be a difficult time. We know that some pupils find change particularly difficult and we will need to plan and prepare for this. Inclusively Down can provide specific advice, training and support to help.

If you are a school or setting that is about to welcome a child or young person with Down syndrome you should consider what training needs you might have, to support, include and to meet their needs most effectively. Upskilling staff so they can prepare accordingly will have a positive impact. Training can be designed for receiving schools as a bespoke whole school/setting course, based on your specific needs. Get in touch to discuss your individual requirements.

For those receiving pupils into new year groups within the same setting you could consider attending one of the external training courses 'Meeting the Learning Needs of Pupils with Down Syndrome' which are available in September 2017.

## Meeting the Learning Needs of Pupils with Down Syndrome

This whole day course is aimed at all staff/professionals working with children and young people with Down syndrome that have not previously had any training. This session will enable you to teach and support Children and Young People with Down syndrome more effectively. It will cover the key elements of the specific learning profile, how you can best support progress, dispel some myths and give you strategies and resource ideas, based on research and good practice, to ensure you can meet their individual learning needs. We will also consider the role of the support assistant and what effective inclusion looks like.

## Developing Literacy Skills: Pupils with Down Syndrome

This half-day training course is suitable for **SENDCOs, Teachers, Support Staff and Parents**. We will look at how children with Down syndrome learn to read, give advice on schemes and programmes which can be used, as well as discuss challenges and how to assess and monitor progress. We will consider difficulties which may be associated with writing and provide practical strategies to use.
